AMENDMENT intended to be proposed by Mr. CORNYN (for himself, Mr. KYL, Mrs. HUTCHISON, and Mr. MCCAIN)

- 3 (a) ADDITIONAL AMOUNT FOR COUNTERDRUG EN-
- 4 FORCEMENT.—For an additional amount for “Salaries
- 5 and Expenses” of the Drug Enforcement Administration,
- 6 \$30,440,000, to remain available until September 30,
- 7 2011, of which—

1 (1) \$15,640,000 shall be available for 180 intel-  
2 ligence analysts and technical support personnel;

3 (2) \$10,800,000 shall be available for equip-  
4 ment and operational costs of Special Investigative  
5 Units to target Mexican cartels; and

6 (3) \$4,000,000 shall be available for equipment  
7 and technology for investigators on the Southwest  
8 border.

9 (b) FIREARMS TRAFFICKING ENFORCEMENT.—For  
10 an additional amount for “Salaries and Expenses” of the  
11 Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives,  
12 \$72,000,000, to remain available until September 30,  
13 2011, of which—

14 (1) \$68,000,000 shall be available for 281 spe-  
15 cial agents, investigators, and officers along the  
16 Southwest border; and

17 (2) \$4,000,000 shall be available for equipment  
18 and technology necessary to support border enforce-  
19 ment and investigations.

20 (c) NATIONAL GUARD COUNTERDRUG ACTIVITIES.—  
21 For an additional amount for “Drug Interdiction and  
22 Counter-Drug Activities, Defense” for high priority Na-  
23 tional Guard Counterdrug Programs in Southwest border  
24 states, \$44,700,000, to remain available until September  
25 30, 2011.

1 (d) HIGH INTENSITY DRUG TRAFFICKING AREAS  
2 PROGRAM.—For an additional amount for Federal Drug  
3 Control Programs, “High Intensity Drug Trafficking  
4 Areas Program” for Southwest border states,  
5 \$140,000,000, to remain available until September 30,  
6 2012.

7 (e) LAND PORTS OF ENTRY.—For an additional  
8 amount to be deposited in the Federal Buildings Fund,  
9 for construction, infrastructure improvements and expan-  
10 sion at high-volume land ports of entry located on the  
11 Southwest border, \$100,000,000, to remain available until  
12 September 30, 2011.

13 (f) BORDER ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL.—For an  
14 additional amount for “Salaries and Expenses” of U.S.  
15 Customs and Border Protection, \$334,000,000, to remain  
16 available until September 30, 2011, of which—

17 (1) \$100,000,000 shall be available for 500  
18 U.S. Customs and Border Protection officers at  
19 Southwest land ports of entry for northbound and  
20 southbound inspections;

21 (2) \$180,000,000 shall be available for equip-  
22 ment and technology to support border enforcement,  
23 surveillance, and investigations;

1           (3) \$24,000,000 shall be available for 120 pi-  
2           lots, vessel commanders, and support staff for Air  
3           and Marine Operations; and

4           (4) \$30,000,000 shall be available for additional  
5           unmanned aircraft systems pilots and support staff.

6           (g) UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEMS AND HELI-  
7           COPTERS.—For an additional amount for “Air and Marine  
8           Interdiction, Operations, Maintenance, and Procurement”  
9           of U.S. Customs and Border Protection, \$169,400,000, to  
10          remain available until expended, of which—

11           (1) \$120,000,000 shall be available for the pro-  
12          curement, operations, and maintenance of at least 6  
13          unmanned aircraft systems to allow for expanded op-  
14          erations of unmanned aircraft systems in Texas,  
15          New Mexico, Arizona, and California on a 7-day-a-  
16          week basis; and

17           (2) \$49,400,000 shall be available for heli-  
18          copters.

19           (h) IMMIGRATION ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL.—For  
20          an additional amount for “Salaries and Expenses” of U.S.  
21          Immigration and Customs Enforcement, \$795,000,000, to  
22          remain available until September 30, 2012, of which—

23           (1) \$175,000,000 shall be available for 500 in-  
24          vestigator positions;

1           (2) \$75,000,000 shall be available for 400 intel-  
2           ligence analyst positions;

3           (3) \$125,000,000 shall be available for 500 de-  
4           tention and deportation positions;

5           (4) \$151,000,000 shall be available for 3,300  
6           detention beds;

7           (5) \$180,000,000 shall be available for equip-  
8           ment and technology to support border enforcement;  
9           and

10          (6) \$89,000,000 shall be available for expansion  
11          of interior repatriation programs.

12          (i) STATE AND LOCAL GRANTS.—For an additional  
13          amount for “State and Local Programs” administered by  
14          the Federal Emergency Management Agency,  
15          \$300,000,000, to remain available until September 30,  
16          2011, which shall be used for—

17               (1) State and local law enforcement agencies or  
18               entities operating within 100 miles of the Southwest  
19               border; and

20               (2) additional detectives, criminal investigators,  
21               law enforcement personnel, equipment, salaries, and  
22               technology in counties in the Southwest border re-  
23               gion.

24          (j) OFFSETTING RESCISSION.—

1           (1) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding section 5 of  
2 the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of  
3 2009 (Public Law 111–5), \$1,986,000,000 of the  
4 amounts appropriated or made available under divi-  
5 sion A of such Act that remain unobligated as of the  
6 date of the enactment of this Act are hereby re-  
7 scinded.

8           (2) ADMINISTRATION.—Not later than 30 days  
9 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Di-  
10 rector of the Office of Management and Budget  
11 shall—

12                   (A) administer the reduction specified in  
13 paragraph (1); and

14                   (B) submit a report to the Committee on  
15 Appropriations of the Senate and the Com-  
16 mittee on Appropriations of the House of Rep-  
17 resentatives that specifies the account and the  
18 amount of each reduction made pursuant to  
19 paragraph (1).
